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# YAHWEH (PART 1)

#### **GOD IS SELF-EXISTENT**

#### **Our Goal**

Today, our goal is for each of us to cultivate the belief that God, as our self-existent Creator, will give to us — and withhold from us — whatever it takes for us to be all that we *can* be and to do all that we *can* do for the sake of His glory.

## Something Greater than the Polish of Man

[Have 1 or 2 read this section: pages **6-7**.]

? What is the point of this story? [The Lord uses trials of affliction and weakness to make us less dependent upon ourselves and more dependent on Him. In doing so, we are emptied of confidence in our abilities so that we might be filled with the power of God. Our Creator knows exactly what we need ... and exactly what we do not need ... to be conformed more to the image of Christ Jesus.]

#### An Education in the School of Brokenness

[Have 1 or 2 read this section: pages **7-9**.]

It is easy for us to see what Moses gained from the first 40 years of his life: a privileged social status, political influence, a formal education in the best of schools, the best of nutritious food, the best medical care in the world. But it might take a little more thought to comprehend the benefits of his second 40 years of life.

? What do you think Moses *gained* from his time in the wilderness herding sheep?

[He was directly exposed to the God of his forefathers.]

[He learned how to shepherd someone else's flock (and would be called upon to do so again with a much larger flock!)]

[He saw what he could have been if he had not received the privileges of his younger days ... a common shepherd.]

[He was humbled from thinking highly of himself: "Who am I ... that I should bring the sons of Israel out of Egypt?" (Exodus 3:11).]

[He became accustomed to living in the wilderness.]

[He learned his way around that area.]

# The Significance of the Name "I AM"

[Have 1 or 2 read this section: pages 9-10.]

[Have someone read footnote 1, page 16.]

We learned that the Name Yahweh highlights the self-existence of God.

? What does that mean, that God is "self-existent"? [God was not created. No one or no thing brought Him into existence. He was not dependent on anyone or anything else outside Himself for His existence. (All creation, however, was dependent upon Him for its existence.)]

[Summarize their answers.]

Just because our finite minds are unable to fully grasp (and explain) an infinite God does not mean we should somehow feel dissatisfied with our faith. To the contrary, our inability to comprehend His perfections should produce within us a sense of joyful security and reverent fear.

? How can our *limited* ability to comprehend the perfections of God *strengthen* us in our faith? [A believer's faith is strengthened when he realizes that he is relying upon an Object greater than himself rather than someone his equal (or his inferior).]

#### Why LORD? Why Did You Do This to Me?

? When God places you in a negative or helpless situation ... one that is going to take more than your own determination to get out of (assuming you can get out of it), why would He do that? Is He not supposed to be making you happy? [Our weaknesses are a priceless gift, intended to force us to depend upon God to fill sense of helplessness with more of Himself. In doing so, His power will be displayed through us, He will receive the glory, and we will share in that glory throughout eternity.]

# The Priceless Gift of Weakness

[Have 2 or 3 read this section: pages **14-16**.]

God is our Creator. And as Creator, He has the *right* to "sculpture" our lives as He sees fit: to give to us ... to withhold from us ... and to remove from us ... what He deems best for both His Name and our wellbeing. *Our* responsibility, as creatures, is to submit in faith to His good – but sometimes difficult-to-understand – will.

[Have someone read 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 12:7-10.]

BECAUSE OF THE SURPASSING GREATNESS OF THE REVELATIONS, FOR THIS REASON, TO KEEP ME FROM EXALTING MYSELF, THERE WAS GIVEN ME A THORN IN THE FLESH, A MESSENGER OF SATAN TO TORMENT ME — TO KEEP ME FROM EXALTING MYSELF! CONCERNING THIS I IMPLORED THE LORD THREE TIMES THAT IT MIGHT LEAVE ME. AND HE HAS SAID TO ME, "MY GRACE IS SUFFICIENT FOR YOU, FOR POWER IS PERFECTED IN WEAKNESS." MOST GLADLY, THEREFORE, I WILL RATHER BOAST ABOUT MY WEAKNESSES, SO THAT THE POWER OF CHRIST MAY DWELL IN ME. THEREFORE, I AM WELL CONTENT WITH WEAKNESSES, WITH INSULTS, WITH DISTRESSES, WITH PERSECUTIONS, WITH DIFFICULTIES, FOR CHRIST'S SAKE; FOR WHEN I AM WEAK, THEN I AM STRONG. (2<sup>ND</sup> CORINTHIANS 12:7-10)

In your reading you were asked, "Do you ever feel that God has slighted you ... that He did not give you a strength He seems to have given everyone else (or perhaps took from you a strength you once had)?"

Then you read, "That is by Divine design. Yahweh knows exactly what to give us to be all that we can be for His glory ... and He knows exactly what to withhold from us to be all that we can be for His glory."

Some things, however, are easy to read ... and easy to agree with in principle ... but hard to accept when it comes to your own life.

? Has there ever been a time when you had trouble accepting what God was doing in your life – or in the life of someone else you cared about – because it did not make any sense? If so, what *did* you do (or what *should* you have done ... or

what are you doing) to set unbelief aside and submit to His purposes? [Spend time in fellowship with the Lord through His Word and prayer. Spend time with fellow believers who are well-grounded in Christ (having spent time in His Word and prayer and having applied God's Word to their lives over time. Read / quote God's promises. Verbally say to Him, "I trust You. Please strengthen me in my faith."]

#### **APPENDIX A**

#### Israel's Use of the Name Yahweh

[Have someone read this section: page **131**.]

The reason the Jews stopped pronouncing the Name "Yahweh" is because of an overreaction to their fear of blasphemy. This, however, may be the lesser of two evils. It is also possible to be *too casual* in our use of God's Name.

? In what ways is the Christian community sometimes *careless* in our use of God's Name?

[Any reference to God using **common** terms ("The Man upstairs," "My Rad Dad in the sky") lessens the reverence and respect He is due.]

[The phrase "My God!" lowers the use of a Name into something much less than an expression of worship.]

[We should not use God's Name to further our own interests (e.g., using the occasion of a worship service – the purpose of which is to exalt the Name of God – to pass out our business cards or using His Name to gain votes during a political election).]

# "Catch Me Pa"

Throughout our lives many people promise to do many things for us: "I will call you back at 10:00." "I will have your car fixed by closing time." "I will stay married to you 'till death do us part." But with most of these people, the best we can do is *hope* that they will be true to their word.

Opie, however, had more than mere hope that his father would catch him. He *knew* that he would. With full assurance, this son trusted his father to keep his promises.

? What do you think it took for Andy to gain his son's full confidence? [Over time, this father kept each of his promises to catch his son. With consistency, this father was true to his word. Andy proved to be a trustworthy father.]

#### **God's Covenant-Promises to Israel**

Before one can prove his faithfulness, he must first promise to do something.

Genesis 15 describes the covenant-relationship the LORD initiated with Abram. The covenant they "cut" is known as the Abrahamic Covenant.

? According to this section, what promises did the LORD make to Abram? [He promised to give Abram: (1) a vast land mass with defined geographical (earthly) borders, (2) innumerable physical descendants and (3) abundant material and spiritual blessings]

? We noted listed several sins committed by Israel in their early history as a nation. What do you think is the worst sin ever committed by Israel? [Their cry for the Messiah to be crucified.]

# **Some Things Just Never Change**

#### The Faithfulness of God

[Have 1 or 2 read this section: pages **21-22**.]

? We identified Israel's worst sin throughout their history as a nation was to demand the crucifixion of the Messiah. In view of this crime, is the Abrahamic Covenant still in effect? If so, why? If not, why not? [Yes, it is still in effect, not because national Israel has been faithful but because Yahweh is ever faithful to His promises to Abram and his descendants.]

[Summarize their answers.]

? If the conduct of national Israel neither maintains nor cancels the Abrahamic Covenant, what difference does it make how they live? [Their obedience to the laws of God would allow them to experience the blessings of the covenant. Their disobedience would prevent them from doing so.]

# Why the LORD Remains Faithful to His Disobedient People

This section answers one of the most important questions God's people can ask: Why would the LORD remain so faithful to a disobedient people? The answer applies to both racial Israel and the New Testament Church. First, let us consider Israel.

[Have someone read this section: pages **22-23**.]

One reason Yahweh is faithful to His covenant-people has to do with what Abram was doing when God established His covenant with him.

? What is the significance of Abram being asleep during this ceremony? [The Abrahamic Covenant is a one-sided covenant. Therefore, the continuation of this covenant does not depend on the faithfulness of Israel. It depends on the faithfulness of God. The LORD alone keeps the terms of this covenant intact. And as we have seen, Yahweh keeps His promises.]

A second reason Yahweh is faithful to His covenant-people is for the sake of His Own Name. He does not want the world to believe He is unable to keep His promises to Israel.

The New Testament Church often fails to obey the commands God has given to us. Yet our salvation remains intact, not because we deserve to "stay saved" but because God is protecting His Name.

- ? Can you think of a promise(s) Yahweh has given to His Church regarding the security of our salvation? [John 10:28-29; Ephesians 1:13, Ephesians 4:30]
- ? So, why has God remained faithful to keep *His Church* saved even though we, too, continue to sin against Him?

[What is true regarding Israel's covenant with God is also true regarding a New Testament believer's salvation ... both are permanent because both depend, not on the merits of man but, on the merits of God and God alone. The true and living Church is "sealed" in the resurrected Christ (Ephesians 1:13). As long as the Son of God remains faithful to the Father (and He always will), the New Testament believer remains eternally secure in his salvation.

[Have someone read Ephesians 1:3.]

BLESSED BE THE GOD AND FATHER OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, WHO HAS BLESSED US WITH EVERY SPIRITUAL BLESSING IN THE HEAVENLY PLACES IN CHRIST. (EPHESIANS 1:3)

[If we obey God's New Testament commands, we will **experience** the goodness of every spiritual blessing we have in Christ. If we disobey these commands, we will not experience the blessings we have in Christ.]

[But we will not lose our salvation. It remains intact because it depends – not on the works of man but – on the faithfulness of the Son of God, in Whom the believer is sealed.]

# Yahweh, the Personal Name of God

[Have someone read footnote **4**, page **26**.]

The Name Yahweh is the personal Name of God. It is a Name that emphasizes His faithfulness to His people. He is a God that keeps His promises.

? What are some ways your heavenly Father kept His promises to you in the past?

[Summarize their answers.]

? Can you think of *one promise* that Yahweh made to you ... but failed to keep, and time has run out? (The question is not, "Can you think of one *desire* you had that God did not grant?")

#### **New Testament Promises**

[Have someone read this section: pages **23-24**.]

When Israel failed to conduct herself as a nation in a covenant-relationship with God, her disobedience did not cancel her covenant with Him. But she *did* forfeit many opportunities to *experience the blessings* of that covenant.

? As a member of the New Testament Church, what steps can you take to ensure that you experience the spiritual blessings you have in Christ? [Study the Scriptures that we might know what the will of God is / trust God (through prayer) to motivate and empower us to obey His will / look for practical ways to put God's Word into practice]

## The Promise of an Eternal Rescue

[Have someone read this section: pages **24-25**.]

[Have someone read Romans 5:8.]

BUT GOD DEMONSTRATES HIS OWN LOVE TOWARD US, IN THAT WHILE WE WERE YET SINNERS, CHRIST DIED FOR US. (ROMANS 5:8)

[Have someone read John 3:16.]

FOR GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD, THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY BEGOTTEN SON, THAT WHOEVER BELIEVES IN HIM SHALL NOT PERISH, BUT HAVE ETERNAL LIFE. (JOHN 3:16)

? When the Father sacrificed His Son, what do you think that was like for Him to do so? What do you think He went through? [The agony of being separated from His Son while He hung on the Cross. The agony of watching His beloved Son die, especially for crimes that He did not commit.]

[Summarize their answers.]

This verse tells us how we should respond to what God did. It tells us we should "believe in His only begotten Son." That is, we should believe something about Christ.

? What exactly are we to believe about His Son? [We are to believe more than His existence. And we are to believe more than His death happened. We are to believe why we needed Him to die (because our sins make us worthy of death and that His Death was in place of our own ... that He died so we would not have to die for our own sins). Unless a person is burdened over the eternal consequences of his sins and cries out to God for mercy ... he cannot be saved.]

[Summarize their answers.]

? Was there any information from this section that was especially *interesting* or *helpful* or *new* to you?

[Give them time to think.]

? Was there anything that was confusing to you or that you disagreed with?"

[Be sure to discuss each issue that is brought up.]

John 3:16 also reveals two promises we can claim if we do trust in Christ for salvation.

? What two promises from this verse can we trust Yahweh to keep if we believe in Christ for salvation? [We will be rescued from eternal death. We will be given eternal life.]

If you have not yet trusted in Christ as the One Who died in your place for your sins, I hope you will feel free to seek me out, that we might talk about this important decision.

#### The Promise of Boundless Forgiveness

[Have someone read this section: page **25**.]

## [Have someone read Revelation 1:4-5.]

JOHN TO THE SEVEN CHURCHES THAT ARE IN ASIA: GRACE TO YOU AND PEACE, FROM HIM WHO IS AND WHO WAS AND WHO IS TO COME, AND FROM THE SEVEN SPIRITS WHO ARE BEFORE HIS THRONE, AND FROM JESUS CHRIST, THE FAITHFUL WITNESS, THE FIRSTBORN OF THE DEAD, AND THE RULER OF THE KINGS OF THE EARTH. TO HIM WHO LOVES US AND RELEASED US FROM OUR SINS BY HIS BLOOD. (REVELATION 1:4-5)

[Have someone read Hebrews 10:16-17.]

"THIS IS THE COVENANT THAT I WILL MAKE WITH THEM AFTER THOSE DAYS, SAYS THE LORD: I WILL PUT MY LAWS UPON THEIR HEART, AND ON THEIR MIND, I WILL WRITE THEM." HE THEN SAYS, "AND THEIR SINS AND THEIR LAWLESS DEEDS I WILL REMEMBER NO MORE." (HEBREWS 10:16-17)

It may be that a *new* believer has not had the time or the teaching to learn that all his sins have been washed away ... and that God remembers them no more.

? But when an older believer continues to struggle with the guilt of his past sins, what may be the problem? [He does not have a copy of the Scriptures to inform him of his deliverance from the penalty and guilt of his sins (ignorance). He knows what the Bible says about Christ's forgiveness of his sins, but he does not allow this truth to free him of this bondage. Or he refuses to believe it (unbelief).]

[Summarize their answers.]

# The Promise of Divine Wisdom

[Have someone read this section: pages **25-26**.]

Let us compare what often happens when we try to solve a distressing situation without consulting the LORD, with the times we take our trials to Him in prayer.

? What are the usual results of trying to deal with a problem apart from prayer compared to the results with prayer? [a spirit of defeat, an attitude of frustration, a sense of wasted time, a less-than-satisfactory change in

circumstances (if any), a less-than-Christ-like attitude / character throughout the trial.]

[Summarize their answers.]

? If these are the usual results of facing a trial without prayer, why then, do you think we are sometimes willing to do so? [Perhaps we go through most of our days' tasks without committing them to God in prayer (e.g., driving to work). In doing so we cultivate / maintain a self-sufficient attitude. When a problem arises, we address it with the same mindset we face our daily tasks: "I can handle this." We would do well to cultivate a spirit of dependence on God, even in the most mundane of tasks: "I need You to help me through all of today."]

# The Promise of a Glorious Home

We have considered only a few of God's many promises He has given to the New Testament Church.

? What are some ways you can continually remind yourself (or a fellow believer) of the promises of God, especially when facing a difficult circumstance? [Create a list of the Bible's promises that address the specific situation you face, regularly meditate upon this list of promises, regularly pray through these promises, ask someone to pray with you through each of these promises, listen to certain Biblecentered songs that address the situation]

Nor were they commanded to cross the river as soon as they arrived at its banks. Israel had to wait three days before they were told to move forward. Perhaps this led some to say, "This does not make any sense. Why is our Lord making us wait?" (Have you ever asked that question?)

[He is training His people to live by faith, not by logic. He does not want us to submit to His will only if we **understand** the **why**. He wants us to submit to His will because we **trust** the **Who**.]

## **Know That the Living God Is Among You**

Why should they have believed that "God was with them" in a labor where human effort had been invested in planning ... and in raising money to purchase materials ... and in recruiting personnel ... and in working hard ... but they saw little fruit? (And for that matter, why should we believe it?)

[The believer who abides in Christ has been promised to bear much fruit (John 15:5); but he is not promised to **see** that fruit. (Those who plant and water are not necessarily present during the harvest.) God's presence with us is not determined by the fruit we see. (If that were true, then God was not with Elijah – 1<sup>st</sup> Kings 19:14 [see vs. 18].)]

[God has not commanded His Church to "Go and make disciples in only those nations 'where you see God at work.'" We are commanded to "Go and make disciples of **all** the nations." If we are obeying the Great Commission, we are in the will of God and, therefore, He is "with (us) always, even to the end of the Age" (Matthew 28:20).]

NOW HE WHO PLANTS AND HE WHO WATERS ARE ONE; BUT EACH WILL RECEIVE HIS OWN REWARD ACCORDING TO HIS OWN LABOR. (1<sup>51</sup> CORINTHIANS 3:8)

EVEN SO CONSIDER YOURSELVES TO BE DEAD TO SIN, BUT ALIVE TO GOD IN CHRIST JESUS. THEREFORE, DO NOT LET SIN REIGN IN YOUR MORTAL BODY SO THAT YOU OBEY ITS LUSTS. (ROMANS 6:8, 10-12)

THEREFORE, SINCE THE CHILDREN SHARE IN FLESH AND BLOOD, HE HIMSELF LIKEWISE ALSO PARTOOK OF THE SAME, THAT THROUGH DEATH HE MIGHT RENDER POWERLESS HIM WHO HAD THE POWER OF DEATH, THAT IS, THE DEVIL. (HEBREWS 2:14)

## What to Do When You Are Abandoned by Others

When we take a broken relationship to the Lord in prayer, our desire and request will often be for the relationship to return to what it once was. And maybe it will. But there is no *guarantee* that it will.

The only person's will we have any degree of control over is our own. We cannot govern someone else's will. If a person we care for turns against us, it could be that the relationship will one day be fully restored ... or at least partially. On the other hand, if he chooses to continue in his rejection of us, the relationship may never be restored to what it once was.

This brings us to Hebrews 4:15-16.

[Have someone read Hebrews 4:15-16.]

FOR WE DO NOT HAVE A HIGH PRIEST WHO CANNOT SYMPATHIZE WITH OUR WEAKNESSES, BUT ONE WHO HAS BEEN TEMPTED IN ALL THINGS AS WE ARE, YET WITHOUT SIN. THEREFORE LET US DRAW NEAR WITH CONFIDENCE TO THE THRONE OF GRACE, SO THAT WE MAY RECEIVE MERCY AND FIND GRACE TO HELP IN TIME OF NEED. (HEBREWS 4:15-16)

We are told to draw near to the throne of grace "with confidence."

? Since two wills are involved in a strained relationship, what exactly can we be confident the Lord will do? [Just because someone has chosen to reject us does not mean that we must reject him. We should not allow his choices to dictate ours. We can have confidence that the Lord will help us do the right thing toward him. We can be confident that He will strengthen and comfort us ... that He will motivate and empower us to love the one who has rejected us ... and that He will give us wisdom to respond to the person in righteousness.]

? According to 1<sup>st</sup> John 5:13, is this letter addressed to believers or unbelievers? [believers]

[Have someone read 1st John 1:9.]

IF WE CONFESS OUR SINS, HE IS FAITHFUL AND RIGHTEOUS TO FORGIVE US OUR SINS AND TO CLEANSE US FROM ALL UNRIGHTEOUSNESS. (1<sup>57</sup> JOHN 1:9)

It was pointed out in your reading that the magnanimous grace of God is greater than any sin we could possibly commit. Instead of wallowing in despair over our sins, 1<sup>st</sup> John 1:9 is presented as the remedy for the sins one commits *as a believer*.

According to this verse, "if we confess our sins, (God) is *righteous* (or just) ... to forgive ... and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

? How can a just Judge be *righteous* and forgive sin at the same time? Isn't a just judge responsible to punish sin? What allows God to forgive, yet remain just? [Because Christ has paid for our sins, God is righteous to pardon those who accept that Payment for themselves. He is not "letting anyone off the hook." The debt was paid for us.]

[Have someone read 1st John 1:6-7.]

If we say that we have **fellowship with Him** and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. (1<sup>st</sup> John 1:6-7)

? What are verses 1:6-7 talking about? [The subject of 1<sup>st</sup> John 1 has to do with the believer's fellowship with God, not his salvation.]

[Have someone read Acts 10:43.]

OF HIM ALL THE PROPHETS BEAR WITNESS THAT THROUGH HIS NAME EVERYONE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM RECEIVES FORGIVENESS OF SINS. (ACTS 10:43)

Here, we are told that "everyone who believes in (Christ Jesus) receives forgiveness of sins." The moment he trusts in Christ for salvation, the believer's sins are washed away ... all of them ... forever.

? If a believer received forgiveness of sins upon faith in Christ, why, then, does 1<sup>st</sup> John 1:9 encourage him to "confess" his sins to be forgiven and cleansed of all unrighteousness? Has he not already been forgiven and cleansed? [Confession of sins allows the believer to remain in close fellowship with the God of his salvation. It allows him to experience the forgiveness he already has through faith in Christ.]

# The Significance of the Name El Olam

#### El Olam Is Eternal

[Have 2 read these two sections: pages **126-127**.]

? If God stopped being eternal, how would that affect you? [It would mean that we really do not have eternal life ourselves. If the Author of eternal life can lose His, then those He sustains will also lose their eternal lives.]

No one has a brighter future in front of him than he who possesses eternal life. In fact, we already possess this eternal life. It has already begun.

? What does your possession of eternal life have to do with you right now? [We need to live our lives with an eternal perspective.]

## El Olam Is Immutable

## The Same Yesterday and Today and Forever

[Have 2 or 3 read this section: pages 127-129.]

We have invested the last several weeks carefully pondering a selection of God's wonderful perfections. In a way it was like examining a beautifully cut diamond. It is only one diamond; but as we observe its every cut reflecting light from its various angles, its beauty becomes increasingly apparent the longer we intently gaze upon it.

? From all the perfections we have considered, is there one particular attribute to which your soul especially clings ... perhaps because of a trial you are going through or because of a certain joyous occasion? If so, why is that attribute so special to you at this time in your life?

### Summary

Today, we have considered the Name El Olam. We have seen

- 1) the Name El Olam also highlights the eternality of God.
- 2) for God to be eternal means that He has always existed. There is no "point" in time when God started to exist, nor is there a "point" in time when He will cease to exist. He has no beginning and no end.

- 3) The eternal character of God allows us to trust in His ability to give to us and to maintain for us our eternal life. Only an eternal God can give eternal life.
- 4) the Name El Olam highlights the unchanging character of God. He is immutable.
- 5) for God to be immutable means that He does not change Himself nor can anyone or anything else change Him.
- 6) the unchanging character of God allows us to be fully assured that God will deal with us just as lovingly and just as wisely as He dealt with His people in the Scriptures.
